CONVOCATION AT CARLETON UNIVERSITY

HISTORY

Carleton University is unique within the Ontario university system for several reasons. It was founded in 1942, not by state or church, but through a community movement initiated by the YMCA to provide non-sectarian education for the thousands of men and women who came to Ottawa in support of the war effort. Because of these roots, Carleton has, throughout its history, attempted to meet the needs of the community by making its programs and resources widely available through innovative technologies and lifelong learning opportunities.

Today, Carleton stands among the best comprehensive universities in Canada. It is a dynamic, research-intensive university, committed to providing an outstanding learning experience for more than 30,000 students. The university offers more than 100 majors, specializations and concentrations in areas as diverse as public affairs, journalism, art and culture, engineering, high technology and international studies.

Today's Convocation ceremony (the calling together of the academic assembly) has its roots in university traditions of medieval Europe.

COAT OF ARMS



The coat of arms was presented to the university by His Excellency The Right Honourable Ramon John Hnatyshyn, Governor General of Canada, on November

15, 1992, as part of Carleton's 50th anniversary celebrations. It is described in heraldic terms as follows: Sable a maple leaf Gules irradiated and charged with an open book Argent; And for a Crest: On a wreath Argent Sable and Gules a Phoenix Gules quilled and beaked Or issuing from flames proper; And for a Motto: Ours the Task Eternal; And for Supporters: on a grassy mount on either side a raven Sable beaked and membered or armed Gules.

The open book on the maple leaf signifies that Carleton University is in the nation's capital and that learning is open to all who wish to partake of it. The phoenix, the legendary eternal bird, symbolizes the renewing of learning from older foundations, in recognition of Henry Marshall Tory's role in the founding of the university when he was 78 years old. Ours the Task Eternal is taken from a Walt Whitman poem entitled *Pioneers* and ties in with the eternal quality of the phoenix.

The Carleton University coat of arms therefore symbolizes sound learning, good citizenship, and the highest hopes of humanity.

THE MACE



The mace is a staff symbolizing authority. In the days of knighthood, it was a weapon, but after the 16th century, it became solely a symbol of authority carried by a distinguished member of an assembly. It is used on ceremonial occasions to signify the right of an individual or institution to perform a certain function — in the case of universities, to grant degrees.

At Convocation, the mace is carried by the Marshal of Convocation. During the ceremony, the mace is displayed as an embodiment of the authority of the university.

Carleton's mace was presented to the university in 1976 as a gift from the Chair of the Board of Governors at that time, Mr. Hyman Soloway. It is a silver-plated staff about one metre long. At the upper end there is a bowl marked with the university's coat of arms and the university motto in Latin and English — Opera Nobis Aeterna and Ours the Task Eternal. From the upper portion of the bowl rises a phoenix. Traditional oak leaves surround the lower end of the staff.

THE EAGLE STAFF

The Eagle Staff is sacred to many Indigenous peoples. It represents the strength and resilience of Indigenous communities and is traditionally carried by someone who has served their community in combat, in leadership or spiritually. In 2013, Indigenous students at Carleton were gifted an Eagle Staff with ribbons and eagle feathers representing First Nation, Métis and Inuit learners. Since then, the staff is carried by an Indigenous student and leads the procession during Convocation. This acknowledges that Carleton University is situated within the unceded and unsundered territories of the Algonquin Nation.

THE DIPLOMA

The diploma graduates receive at Convocation is the certificate of qualification which publishes the fact that the student has fulfilled all the requirements and completed the prescribed course of study for the degree. As the senior academic legislative body of the university, it is the Senate which has determined whether the requirements have been met. The signatures of the Chancellor and the President of the university appear on the diploma: the Chancellor because of his or her role in conferring the degree, and the President who, as Chair of Senate, certifies that Senate has enacted the required motion to award the degree. The seal of the university is affixed to the diploma as a mark of authentication.

ACADEMIC DRESS

The academic dress of Carleton University results from a compromise between that found in the ancient foundations of Britain and Canada and the American Intercollegiate Code.

As well, Indigenous graduates and faculty may choose to wear traditional Indigenous attire in lieu of a gown. The hood may be carried rather than worn, depending on cultural protocols. Carleton acknowledges the diversity of Indigenous peoples, communities and nations and recognizes that traditional Indigenous attire may vary.

All three academic hoods — bachelor's, master's and doctor's — are of the simple or Oxford shape. The bachelor's hood is made of black stuff. The master's and doctor's are made of black silk. All are lined with silver silk, with two chevrons, one of red and one of black. From bachelor's to doctor's, the hoods are progressively longer and opened to show more of the lining.

The velvet border of the hoods denotes the degrees granted according to the following colour combinations. In some cases a distinguishing cord is sewn slightly in from the lower border: accounting is lemon yellow; applied science is orange with a black cord; architecture is hot pink; architectural studies is hot pink with a black cord; arts is white; cognitive science is sky blue with a gold cord; commerce is camel brown; communications and media studies is navy blue; computer science is walden blue; economics is old gold; engineering is golden poppy; entrepreneurship is palmetto green; global and international studies is lavender; health sciences is firebird red; humanities is white with a red cord; industrial design is toreador red; master of information technology is maize; bachelor of information technology is maize including a green chevron to denote the joint degree and applied diploma from Carleton University and Algonquin College respectively; infrastructure protection and information security is sky blue with a red cord; international business is camel brown with a red cord; journalism is white with a black

cord; journalism and humanities is white with black and red cord; management studies and business administration are camel brown with a black cord; mathematics is hunter green; media production and design is white with black and gold cord; music is pink; philanthropy and non-profit leadership is toreador red with black cord; political management is sky blue with black cord; public affairs and policy management is peacock with a gold cord; public policy and administration is peacock with a black cord; science is Spanish yellow; social work is crimson; and doctor of philosophy is royal purple.

The master's and bachelor's gowns, to be worn with the above hoods, are of full length, made of black stuff, with a gathered yoke behind, and long open-fronted sleeves. The doctoral gown is of full-style, made of fine royal blue cloth with facings of light blue silk, with a full gathered yoke behind, and closed sleeves with an opening at the elbows.

The two shades of blue in the doctoral gown are those of the United Nations, and recognize the university's long-standing interest, from its earliest years, in international affairs and issues. The colours were chosen when the university awarded its first honorary degree in 1954 to the second secretary general of the United Nations, Dag Hammarskjöld. The tradition of awarding honorary degrees to secretaries general of the United Nations has continued since that time.

The gown of the honorary Doctor of Laws, Literature, Music, Science, Engineering, Architecture or Fine Arts is a full robe with bell-shaped sleeves. It is made of fine royal blue cloth with facings and sleeves in light blue silk. The hood is made of the same material as the gown, has the same lining as that for the degrees granted by examination, and is bordered with royal purple for the degree of Doctor of Laws; vibrant blue for the degree of Doctor of Literature; pink for the degree of Doctor of Music; red for the degree of Doctor of Science; orange for the degree of Doctor of Engineering; hot pink for the degree of Doctor of Architecture; and dark cardinal for the degree of Doctor of Fine Arts.

ALUMNI HALL

The Alumni Hall and Sports Centre opened in 2005, and serves more than 750,000 visitors every year. The new centre has tripled the usage for athletic and other activities and has doubled the size of the cardio facilities at the university. The Alumni Hall and Sports Centre, which also houses the Ravens' Nest, the home of men's and women's varsity basketball teams, welcomes graduands and their families twice a year during Spring and Fall Convocation ceremonies. The Carleton University Alumni Association donated \$2.5 million towards construction of this exceptional facility.

OFFICIATING OFFICERS

Chancellor of the University



Yaprak Baltacioğlu, LL.B., M.A.

Yaprak Baltacioğlu was named the 12th Chancellor of Carleton University in December 2018. She is an alumna and accomplished public sector leader who has been a trailblazer, adviser and mentor for civil servants across Canada. Her award-winning career in the federal civil service spanned more than 25 years. She has been honoured by the Public Policy Forum and was twice recognized by the Women's Executive Network as one of Canada's Top 100 Most Powerful Women. Baltacioğlu is a professor at the University of Toronto's Munk School of Global Affairs and Public Policy. She also serves on the boards of the Institute of Corporate Directors, Hydro Ottawa, Canadian Nuclear Laboratories and the Stratford Festival.

The President and Vice-Chancellor



Benoit-Antoine Bacon, Ph.D.

Benoit-Antoine Bacon was appointed as President and Vice-Chancellor on July 1, 2018. He joined Carleton from Queen's University where he served as Provost and Vice-Principal (Academic). His first academic appointment was at Bishop's University. He is a three-time recipient of Bishop's Merit Award for exceptional performance in teaching and research. Dr. Bacon holds a Ph.D. in neuropsychology from the University of Montreal, after which he completed an NSERC-funded postdoctoral fellowship at the University of Glasgow in Scotland. His research in the field of cognitive neuroscience focuses on the links between brain activity and perception in the visual and auditory systems, as well as on multi-sensory integration.

Chair of the Board of Governors



Nik Nanos, HCapt (N), M.B.A.

The son of Greek immigrants, Nik Nanos is Chief Data Scientist and Founder of the Nanos Research Group of Companies. Nanos is a leading corporate business strategist, conducting market and public opinion research and providing counsel to diverse organizations, including Fortune 500 companies and non-profit groups. He has undergraduate degrees in history and political studies and a Master of Business Administration from Queen's University. His training includes PhD-level studies in quantitative methods at the University of Nottingham. He is a Research Associate Professor at the State University of New York and a Global Fellow at the Woodrow Wilson International Center for Scholars.

The Presiding Officer of Convocation is the Chancellor of the University, Yaprak Baltacioğlu, LL.B., M.A.

UNIVERSITY AWARDS

Founders Award



Carleton University's highest non-academic honour recognizes and pays tribute to those individuals who have made significant contributions to the advancement of Carleton University through their dedication, generosity and commitment to the values of the university.

Dr. Samy Mahmoud, *M.Eng., Ph.D., P.Eng.*

Dr. Mahmoud holds a Bachelor of Applied Science in Engineering ('68) from Ain Shams University, and Master ('71) and PhD ('75) degrees in Electrical Engineering from Carleton University. He joined the Faculty of Engineering and Design at Carleton in 1975.

He launched a career of dedicated service that spanned more than four decades, holding several key academic leadership roles at Carleton, including Chair of the Department of Systems and Computer Engineering for 12 years ('86-'98) and Dean of the Faculty of Engineering and Design for the next eight years ('98-'06). During his tenure, he helped transform the faculty into one of Carleton's flagship programs with new and innovative programming and substantial research facilities.

He also served as Acting Provost and Vice-President Academic ('06) and President and Vice-Chancellor, pro tempore, ('06-'08). He left Carleton briefly to become the fifth Chancellor of the University of Sharjah (UAE) before returning to Carleton as Professor Emeritus with the Faculty of Engineering and Design ('15).

Dr. Mahmoud was the founder and principal investigator of a number of provincial and federal Research Networks of Excellence in which Carleton University assumed a leading role, including the Ontario Centre for Information and Telecommunication Research (CITR), the Canadian Photonics Fabrication Centre and the Centre for Photonics Fabrication Research. He was also a founding member and group leader of the National Centre of Information and Telecommunications (NCIT).

He has received numerous awards for research achievements, including TRIO and Stentor National awards for technology transfer to industry, as well as best paper awards for original research at two IEEE international conferences. He has published widely in refereed international engineering journals and is the co-author of several books in the fields of telecommunications and electronics.

Dr. Mahmoud's commitment to excellence in teaching and research included supervising more than 100 graduate students at the doctoral and master's levels, guiding them to achieve their career goals and to advance engineering research.

Board of Governors Award for Outstanding Community Achievement



The Board of Governors Award recognizes the spirit of student volunteerism and substantial community contribution while studying full time at Carleton University.

Frohan Foroutan, *B.Econ.*

First in her family to attend university, Foroutan is graduating with a Bachelor of Economics (Honours) with a double concentration in Economic Theory and Mathematics and Quantitative Economics.

She contributed immensely to Carleton University both in terms of academics and volunteerism. For the better part of a decade, she mentored, coached, taught, tutored and guided her peers to academic success through a variety of programs on campus, including the Paul Menton Centre for Students with Disabilities, the Enriched Support Program, First Year Connections and Bounce Back Program. Through these programs, Foroutan dedicated 10 hours a week to mentoring and supporting marginalized and at-risk students, including first-in-the-family students, international students, cancer patients, mature learners and students with disabilities.

The Board of Governors was impressed by Foroutan's dedication to her peers' academic success, as well as her ability to maintain a high academic standing while studying in her fourth language. The Board noted her exceptional compassion, determination and unparalleled leadership.

An aspiring economist, Foroutan has accepted an offer to join Carleton's Master of Economics with a Specialization in Data Science commencing in fall 2019.

- For the designation *Distinction*, an overall cumulative grade point average equal to or greater than 9.80 (on a 12-point scale).

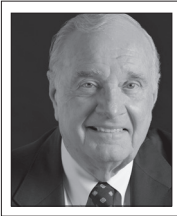

HONORARY DEGREE RECIPIENT

The Right Honourable Paul Martin, B.A., LL.B.



The Right Honourable Paul Martin will be awarded the degree of Doctor of Laws, *honoris causa*, at the 9:30 a.m. ceremony on Friday, June 14, “in recognition of his leadership in the Canadian government.”

Martin was prime minister of Canada from 2003 to 2006 and finance minister from 1993 to 2002, where he erased Canada’s deficit and recorded five consecutive budget surpluses while paying down the national debt and setting Canada’s debt-to-GDP ratio on a steady downward track.

Before entering politics, Martin had a long career in the private sector. He graduated from the University of Toronto’s St. Michael’s College and Faculty of Law. He was called to the Ontario Bar in 1966.

In 1999, as co-founder, he served as inaugural chair for three years of the G20 Finance Ministers and Central Bank Governors.

As prime minister, Martin set in place a plan to improve health care and reduce wait times. He also signed agreements with the provinces and territories to establish the first national early learning and child care program.

Under Martin’s leadership, the federal government reached a historic consensus with the 2006 Kelowna Accord to eliminate funding gaps in health, education and housing after an 18-month consultation process involving Canada’s provinces, territories, Indigenous peoples, Métis Nation and Inuit leaders.

After leaving public life, Martin advised the African Development Bank and has worked closely with the Advisory Council of the Coalition for Dialogue on Africa. He was also a founding co-chair of the Congo Basin Forest Fund and a Commissioner for the Global Ocean Commission.

In 2009, Martin joined members of his family to create the Martin Family Initiative. Its mission is to walk alongside Indigenous experts, communities and leaders to ensure that opportunities for Indigenous children are abundant and culturally appropriate.

In 2012, he was appointed Companion to the Order of Canada.

He is married to Sheila Ann Cowan and they have three sons and five grandchildren.

Yazmine C. Laroche



Yazmine C. Laroche will be awarded the degree of Doctor of Laws, *honoris causa*, at the 2:00 p.m. ceremony on Friday, June 14, “in recognition of her distinguished career in the federal public service and, in particular, her significant contribution to greatly improved accessibility for all Canadians.”

She was appointed Canada’s first-ever deputy minister for Public Service Accessibility in 2018 and is the first visibly disabled person to be appointed to serve in a deputy minister role in the federal public service.

Her mandate is to design a strategy to make the Canadian public service the gold standard of accessibility and inclusion.

Laroche has had an illustrious career, holding progressively more senior leadership responsibilities in areas as diverse as arts policy, transport, infrastructure, strategic planning and financial management.

An avid world traveler with a mission to make things better, Laroche’s work has shaped Canada’s conversation about people with disabilities, accessibility and awareness.

She serves as Deputy Minister Champion for Federal Employees with Disabilities. Her role ensured that the voices of public servants with disabilities were incorporated into Bill C-81, the Accessible Canada Act.

Laroche is also the Deputy Minister Champion for her alma mater Carleton University, where she obtained her Bachelor of Arts in Mass Communications in 1982.

She is a director and former chair of Muscular Dystrophy Canada.

She led the New Deal for Cities and Communities, which includes earmarking federal funds to support national objectives for sustainable communities. Most recently, she oversaw the Gordie Howe International Bridge project, expected to set standards in innovation and creativity.

She was awarded the Queen Elizabeth II Diamond Jubilee Medal in 2012 for her work in the community.
